Annual Golf Tournament Raises more than \$70,000 for Post-Secondary Scholarships

ANISHINAABE AND DAKOTA TERRITORY, MB — The Southern Chiefs' Organization (SCO) and the Southern Chiefs' Economic Development Corporation (SCEDC) thank the committed businesses, organizations, and individuals that supported the third annual golf tournament. Through a partnership with Indspire, more than \$70,000 in annual and endowed scholarships will be awarded to students from SCO-member communities, building on the \$45,000 in scholarships raised last year.
