The Southern Chiefs' Organization (SCO) Harm Reduction Program aims to help keep our loved ones safe and offer positive change through minimizing harms.

The program provides harm reduction supplies such as fentanyl test strips, nasal Narcan, and safer sex supplies, at no cost.

SCO also has a Harm Reduction Awareness Coordinator who is available to provide education and training to promote destigmatization and raise awareness around the importance of using a harm reduction approach when working with First Nations citizens living with a substance use disorder.
